Review of 2023 Calls and Hours and Financial Report

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a Fire Board meeting was duly held at City Hall on the 7th day of March 2023 at 7:00 pm.

THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS WERE PRESENT:

Minutes were reviewed. No changes or additions were noted.

Motion Craig Guggenberger to approve minutes second Terry Stein and carried unanimously.

Avon Fire Relief Association Carl Verdon gave an update on the Relief Association's financial status. Investments are down around 10%. With the markets down and an expected deficit, the benefit level will remain at \$2,600. Total cash and investments equal around \$764,079.

Avon Fire Hall

Discussion of the Avon Fire Hall project. W Gohman was appointed as the Design Builder/Construction Manager for the project. City Clerk/Administrator, Assistant Chief Chuck Swenson, and Mayor Manthe met with City Attorney and W. Gohman to go over the proposed contract. All parties appear to be at a point of agreement on the terms of contract so a contract will be drafted. Austing-Traut has reached out go Gohman to see if they are willing to being the preliminary design phase of the process while contract is being finalized. Gohman has agreed to begin the process by meeting with the fire department's committee to get preliminary design on paper. Once there is something to share with the Fire Hall Building Committee, a meeting will be set to review and comment.

Avon Township Board of Supervisors met and have discussed the process. Township Annual meetings are coming up. Bresnahan asked if there was any update on the total cost of the project. City financial advisor put together a very rough bond schedule to give an idea of what a repayment plan might look like on a rough \$2 million project. In that scenario an annual payment might be around \$175,000 divided between the three entities based on the standard calculation that is used for depreciation. The group continued to discuss cost saving methods including seeking grants, local donations, and other financial contributions.

Fire Hall Building Committee will plan to Tuesday April 18th at 6:30 when information becomes available and needs input/review from the oversight committee.

Purchases in 2022

Total Capital Expenditures were \$45,807 in 2022. These funds were spent on equipment including desktop radio, portable radios, headset radio, water rescue suits, turnout gear, and radios.

Membership

Currently there are 26 fully trained members. Would like to consider hiring a few more members at some point to keep those numbers up in preparation for any pending retirements.

Fundraisers Planned

Spunk Days Raffle (average of \$9,000 per year) Golf Outing (average of \$20,000 per year) Calendar Ads (average of \$7,500 per year)

Billing of Calls

Billing for calls has remained the same. Structure fires have a \$500 flat fee with a letter advising to turn into insurance. Illegal burns are billed. Serenity Village has been relying heavily on the AFD for lift assists and a number

of other potentially non-emergency situations. There are some legislative issues that are creating some of this additional call volume. AFD has met with staff at Serenity Village on several occasions to try to work this out.

Future Plans

The plan is to stay on the depreciation schedule for trucks. Possibly waiting a bit to see how the fire hall project moves forward prior to purchasing the next piece of major equipment.

ISO Rating

The ISO rating has gone up rather than down. Chief Richter will continue to work with the rating group to determine how to get it changed back. Equipment is better and training is better than it used to be. The concern is that the rating group inaccurately documented our equipment check records.

Wage Increases

Bylaws are being amended. One amendment being proposed is to give the fire department the same annual Cost of Living Increase that other city staff receive.
